Family : Oleaceae

Distribution and Habitat: Throughout South India, on dry slopes of Western Ghats

Botany: A scandent, pubescent or velvety shrub with grey- pubescent branchlets.

• **Leaves:** Trifoliate with two lower leaflets very small, central leaflets broadly ovate, acuminate or rounded, main nerves few inconspicuous, petioles very short.

• **Flower:** White, sweet scented many in trichotomous paniculate cymes, corolla lobes 5-8.

• **Fruits:** Globose, black.

Uses: Skin diseases especially for ring worm, burning sensation, cardiopathy, nephrolithiasis, dermatopathy

Propagation: By stem cuttings
