**Distribution and habitat:** Throughout India. Prefer shady and humid conditions.

Botany: Small hairy annual/perennial herb, slow growing, branches numerous, wiry, often prostrate

• **Leaves**: Alternate, simple, petiolate, elliptic-oblong or oblong-ovate, leaf blade  $0.4\text{-}2.5~\mathrm{cm} \times 1.25~\mathrm{cm}$ 

• *Flowers:* Light blue, solitary or sometimes in pairs, axillary, jointed near the middle of the peduncle where two small opposite lanceolate bracteoles are present

• *Fruits*: Globose 4-valved drooping capsules.

**Properties:** General tonic, brain stimulant, febrifuge, anthelminthic, antispasmodic, aphrodisiac, and antifungal. **Chemical constituents:** Amino acids,  $\beta$ -sitosterol, carbohydrates, pantatriacontane, phenolic compounds, phenols triacontane.

Uses: Fever, nervous debility, cure dysentery and stomach ache, applied on wounds. It is used as a blood purifier.

Agrotechnology:

**Propagation:** cuttings, seeds. Seeds require hot water treatment for germination.

**Harvest:** Complete life cycle in 4 months and the plant is harvested.
